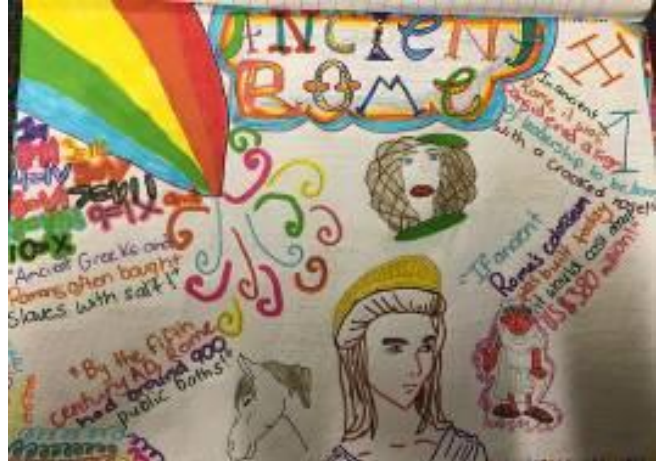
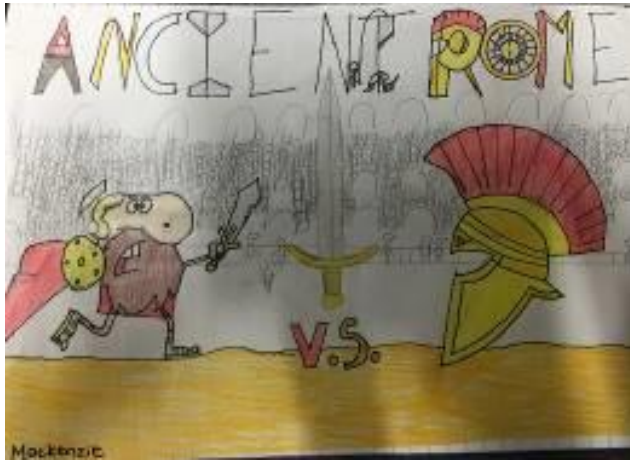

Year 5 / 6 / 7 Class

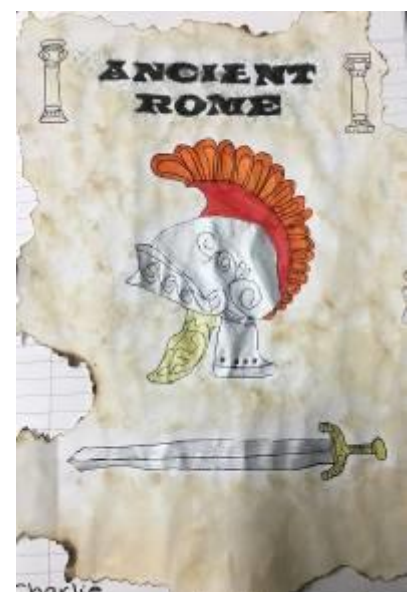
The 5/6/7 Class has been working hard at their HASS Ancient Rome title pages – see below for an example of the fantastic work the students have been doing.
