

In 2021 our school was invited to join our cluster schools; Uraidla, Basket Range and Lenswood Primary to participate in **Berry Street Education Program**.

The Berry Street Education Model (BSEM) provides a whole school approach to strategies for teaching and learning that enables teachers to increase engagement of students with unmet learning needs and to successfully improve all students' self-regulation, relationships, wellbeing, growth and academic achievement through the use of inclusive educational strategies teaching positive education and wellbeing practices. The whole school approach to this program, creates a common language amongst staff and students and will strengthen our Visible Learning and Growth mindset strategies already implemented across the school.

I am very excited about this opportunity and can see many great benefits this training will provide our staff, students and broader school community as we collaboratively strive towards further developing a culture of personal growth and social awareness through a focus on wellbeing that is positive, inclusive, empathetic and resilient.

SCHOOL FEES

Please note we only offer three instalments. We have decided on this option so the students have access to 2022 funds in 2022. School purchases occur in the first 3 terms, so it only seems fitting that fees are paid within these terms.

NB The school relies heavily on everyone paying their school fees to operate. Please ensure you pay by the due dates. (The school does make use of Debt Collectors when fees are unpaid.)

SCHOOL INCURSION LEVY

A levy of \$65 will be charged to your account to cover Book Week celebrations, Science and theatre performances held at the school during the year. This levy is voluntary but if you choose not to pay the levy, your child may not attend the events. Individual payments can be made before the event to ensure your child can attend. Please note that as the year progresses there may be additional fees for new or unplanned cultural and learning opportunities.

SCHOOL SHORT SPORTS

A levy of \$30 for sport clinics that come to the school will also be charged to your account. Again, this is voluntary but if you choose not to pay the levy, your child will not attend the events. Individual payments can be made before the event to ensure your child can attend. Please note there may be additional opportunities that occur during the year that may incur an additional fee.
