### Mercado Maravilloso (Marvellous Market)

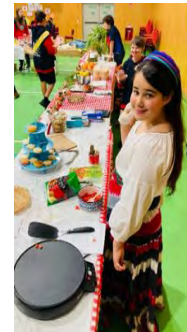
Congratulations to everyone who helped us celebrate our Spanish Marvellous Market.

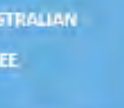
